

Our "Adopt a Family" program continues in earnest. We had hoped to stop with the build out of one abandoned non-functional bathroom and a clean up of the only working one the family has had for some time.

Upon careful inspection, we found a rusted out bathtub, leaking exterior wall with rotted wood, plumbing leaks into the dining area wall, an active carpenter ant nest the size of a grapefruit, and all sorts of vermin living in the rot. The Masonic Cour-

age Award should go to Brother Joseph Mica who bravely demolished the room until we got to clean, solid surfaces.
